The Dutch Masters have nothing on our Silver Fox of the Month, Margaret (Greet Smeets) Stommel. She has five brothers and a son who are artists, as was her husband, Frank, who passed on in 2007. A sister also works in tapestries. Their works are prominently displayed throughout Margaret's house, and a visit requires that you see the gallery.

Margaret (born in Ottersum, Holland, number seven with eight brothers and two sisters) met Frank (born in Amsterdam) through his sister, who attended Home Economics School with her. They were married at De Sint Jan Church in Van's Hertogenbosch on August 8, 1945. Their three sons (Paul, Bob, and Peter) were born in Amsterdam, while their three daughters (Angelique, Josine, and Miriam) were born in Beek-Ubbergen. All were born at home.

The Stommels, dreading the thought of their children growing up and moving away from them, decided to emigrate the family to the U.S. in 1956. The National Catholic Welfare Conference, which had promised them a job and housing, failed to come through, and they had to live in a hotel for ten days before renting a one-bedroom house complete with cockroaches for \$80 a month in San Diego. Larger houses were unavailable because no one wanted to rent to such a large family.

Frank worked at several different jobs before moving to Fresno with the help of a friend, Father Zegwoard. Trained in textiles, he eventually became manager of the decorating department at Sears, Fresno. He had to retire with total
